

Care Sheet for Devon Rex kitten

Prior To Your Kitten Arriving

Set up food, fresh water and a litterbox in a room isolated from other pets. Your kitten needs time to feel safe, while becoming familiar with new surroundings. Introduce resident pets slowly. The settling period can range from one day to one week. Each baby is unique and will determine when he/she feels at ease.

After your kitten indicates through body language that he/she feels secure, begin to introduce other rooms in your home. Supervise visits with resident pets until you are certain your kitten is safe.

Make sure that litter box is not next to the water and food bowls.

Feeding

Use stainless steel or glass for food dishes as plastic can cause dermatitis of the chin due to the antioxidant in plastic.

Your kitten is eating:

- Dry food “Purina Pro Plan for kittens under one”
- raw food mix:

The dry food must be available at all times till your kitten is turning 1 (one). Later consult your veterinarian.

Litter

We use 100% natural “LG Premium 40-lb Carbon Neutral Wood Pellets” and “So Phresh Sifting Cat Litter Box”. Which you can easily find in any “Canadian Tire”.

Playtime

Our cats/kittens are used to have cat tree, scratching post and toys (such as soft balls, springs and ping-pong balls).

Safety

Devon Rexes are active, intelligent, curious and athletic cats. Listed below are some safety hazards:

- The kitchen: When cooking, it's best to keep your kitten out of the kitchen. If your kitten jumps onto the stove and lands on a heating element it could result in burned paw pads.
- Keep knives in drawers after each use.
- Poisonous plants (inform yourself about all plants that you have in the house)
- Water: kittens are fascinated with water so keep toilet lids down. If your kitten is very young do not allow unsupervised play in the bathroom when the bathtub is full.
- Cleaning Products: Harsh chemicals or strong-smelling products used in your home.
- Laundry Detergents: Scented detergents, fabric softeners, or dryer sheets used for items kitten might frequently come into contact with.
- Air Fresheners: Aerosols, diffusers, or plug-in air fresheners can release substances that irritate cats.
